The Australian Ultra calendar has been hard hit by the coronavirus pandemic, but a few races are taking place in the States less effected by the virus. As always, check the AURA calendar (http://aura.asn.au/) for the latest news.

Locally, Justin and Sharon Scholz have had to cancel the 2020 Ned Kelly Chase, which was to be held in Wangaratta, in country Victoria, on Sunday 25th October. The worsening COVID situation in Victoria forced the decision for them. I also note that the Adelaide 6 Day Race has just been cancelled as well. A shame there as it has been gaining momentum as an event.

On a happier note, the iconic Coast to Kosci ultra is back on the table, after a 2year absence. Here are some of the details which were released on the coast2kosci facebook page (https://www.facebook.com/coast2kosci) a couple of weeks ago.

The 240km race is invitation only and is limited to 50 of the best ultra-marathon runners in the country. The race starts on the beach at Eden, NSW and finishes 240km later at Charlotte Pass after the runners have summitted Mount Kosciuszko, Australia's highest peak. Coast To Kosciuszko will be held in its traditional timeslot of the first weekend in December, commencing 5:30am Friday 4 December, with the cut-off time of 3:30am Sunday 6 December. It will be the 12th time the iconic ultramarathon has been held. Coast To Kosciuszko, the most challenging ultramarathon in Australia was last held in 2017. Entries open 3 August via the website which will be updated soon.

6 JOURS DE FRANCE, PRIVAS, FRANCE, 16-22 AUGUST

The annual French 6 Day Championships have just finished in Privas, with 6 Days, 48 Hour and 24 Hour divisions for both walkers and runners. Of course, the 6 Day event was the main one, with a very strong field of 35 runners and 9 walkers. Full results for all events are to be found at https://www.6jours-de-france.fr/resultats/.

In the 6 Day walk, **Dominique Delange** headed out confidently and led for the first 3 days, his lead at that stage an impressive 15km. However, he faltered on Day 4, allowing **Christophe Biet** and **Claudie Bizard** to overtake him. The three of them were well clear of the remaining walkers and finished in that order – Biet first with 600.877km, Bizard second with 585.933km and Delange third with 511.548km. Biet finished the strongest, covering 100km in the final day. Claudie Bizard also kept it all together excellently, passing 500km in 121:31:20 and walking 96km on the last day.

Emmanuel Tardi notes that **Bertrand de Marcillac** was born on 22nd July 1939, meaning he is currently 81 years old. However, his distance of 390.264km was short of the M80 World Best of 431km, held by our own Stan Miskin (C23).

WORLD 100KM PERFORMANCES

Emmanuel Tardi recently posted this photo of French walker **Jean-Pierre Garcia** in the process of setting a new 100km Track World Record time of 9:33:06.0 in St Denis, France, on 16th March 1975.



That record was bettered a year later, on 28th March 1976, in Saint Maur by French walker **Roger Quemener**, with a time of 9:23:58. Then 11 years later, on 19th April 1987, French walker **Frédéric Marie** set the current world record of 9:16:32.2 in Etrechy. That got me thinking it was time to get an up to date ranking list. And who better to ask than our go-to-man Emmanuel Tardi. And he was up to the task, forwarding to me his latest 100km rankings lists for both men and women. I have uploaded them to our website as per the following links

Here are brief extracts from each ranking list, just showing the best time for each of the walkers. Belarussian walker **Viktor Ginko** heads the men's list with an astonishing 8:38:07. But perhaps not quite so astonishing when you consider he was a dual Olympian (1996 and 2000), with a 50km PB of 3:42:20. I would refer readers to a superb bio/interview with Ginko on site https://klbviktoria.com/news/1-05-2010-1.html. It is in Russian so you will need to be viewing in Google Chrome, then right click with the mouse and choose 'Translate to English'.

The women's list is lead by Latvian racewalker **Jolanta Dukure**, another highly credentialled international walker who was second in the 1998 IAAF World Junior Championships 10,000m walk and who went on to represent her country in two Olympic Games (2000 and 2008). She holds the Latvian records for all racewalking distances from 5000m to 50km (4:16:27). Her 100km time of 10:04:50 is pretty impressive! The women's Track World Record is held by the mighty **Sandra Brown**, her time of 11:17:42 set in Etrechy on 27th October 1990. And our top three Australian women, **Michelle Thompson** (16th), **Sharon Scholz** (21st) and **Carol Baird** (31st) are also in the list.

THE 1955 LONDON TO BRIGHTON AND BACK WALK

I was recently pointed to a British Pathe newsreel of the 1955 Sunday Dispatch London To Brighton & Back Walking Race. A total distance of 104 miles, it was won by 39 year old **Hew Neilson**, one of the greatest of the English centurions. Check it out at https://youtu.be/PBWWPa7Oero. I was already familiar with the video and have previously written of Hew Nielson (https://www.vrwc.org.au/tim-archive/articles/wo-hew-neilson.pdf), and thought that the video would provide a springboard to discuss one of the greatest of the London to Brighton and Back races.

With 92 entries and 79 starters, the 1955 edition was by far the largest field ever assembled for this classic race. Even more impressive was the fact that 47 of the 79 starters reached the 100 mile mark in under 24 hours. Of these 47, 31 were first timers, thus becoming new English Centurions (C229 - C259). 21 walkers retired from the race at that point but a valiant 26 continued on to the end, completing the full 104 miles.

The wonderful record of 18:05:32, set by Billy Baker, remained untouched, but Hew Nielson of Woodford Green produced a great performance to win with 18:26:27, the third best ever behind Tommy Hammond and Baker. Nielson was hard challenged by **Vic Stone** of Polytechnic Harriers. Nielson had built up a good lead of 17 minutes with 20 miles to go, but Stone finished the stronger and was slowly reducing the deficit mile by mile, eventually finishing only 6 minutes and 30 secs in arrears.

Further back in the field, **Archie Brown** of St. Dunstone & Poly. Harriers, accompanied by **Fred Duff**, battled along gamely to finish the full course and become the first blind centurion. Polytechnic Harriers did well to get 5 finishers in tehe 26 and they deservedly won the team race, with Essex Beagles second and Woodford third.

Here are the results of those 47 walkers who reached the 100 mile mark inside 24 hours.

It is a ripping yarn and is a nice bookend to my London to Brighton And Back article above.

YEARNING FOR THE OLD DAYS OF THE END-TO-END CLASSICS

I was recently discussing the End-to-End Classic walks which used to be on offer around the world, but which are now all gone. We had lots in our Victorian racewalking fixture but we were eventually forced off the roads by the police and local councils. The same happened in England with their long distance walking classics.

The 1962 RWA book "The Sport Of Race Walking" lists the winners of the following ultra distance classics up to and including 1962. I've added a bit more info to note the event termination date, when known.

London to Brighton Open - 1886 until 1985, with a once off edition held in 1998.

London to Brighton Stock Exchange Walk - 1903 onwards - not sure when it stopped

The Bradford Walk (30-40 miles depending on the year) - 1903 onwards

The Croydon to Godstone and Back - 18 ½ miles - 1909 onwards.

Police A.A. Barking to Southend Walk - 32 1/4 miles - 1921 onwards

London to Brighton and Back - 1902, 1903, 1907, 1921, 1926, 1929, 1933, 1937, 1947, 1951, 1955, 1959 1963, 1967 **Hastings to Brighton** - 37 miles - 1930 onwards

Manchester to Blackpool - 50 miles - 1909 onwards until it was stopped in the mid nineties.

They were all still going when the book was published in 1962 but they all disappeared over the course of time. Hastings to Brighton was still going when I was there in 1980, as was the London to Brighton.

There were other point to point races held as Centurion qualifiers. These were not annual races but were held intermittently

Bath to London - 100 Miles - 1952, 1957

Birmingham to London - 103 ½ miles - 1953

Blackpool to Manchester and Back - 100 miles - 1954

Sheffield to Harrowgate and Back - 100 Miles - 1955

Leicester to Skegness - 100 miles - 1958, 1960, 1962, 1964, 1966, 1968, 1970, 1972, 1974, 1976, 1978, 1980, 1982

From 1984 onwards, the Leicester hundred was changed to a course at Congerstone and later to Hungarton. The iconic Leicester to Skegness was decommissioned after the 1982 race.

Ah, for the good old days!
