SRI CHINMOY 48 HOUR CARNIVAL, CANBERRA, 25-26 MARCH 2023

I travelled to Canberra a couple of weeks ago to attend the annual Sri Chinmoy 48 Hour Carnival, which was held at the AIS Athletics Track. It had been awarded AURA Australian 48 Hour Track Championship status and included 48 Hour, 24 Hour, 12 Hour and Marathon divisions.

I was there in particular to verify the performances of **David Billett (C50)** and **Joffrid Mackett (C82)** who had both informed me that they they would be competing in the 48 Hour event as walkers. And did they produce the goods!

They had both been aiming to walk 100 miles in the first 24 Hours, thus adding another centurion walk to their resume. They walked together for most of that timeframe, chatting and supporting each other. Joffrid got there first, with a time of 23:47:02, followed a lap later by David, with a time of 23:51:18. It was Joff's second centurion walk (after qualifying in this same event last year) and David's seventh. Here's how their tallies now look.

They then continued on, shifting their focus to the 48 Hour and looking to challenge the Australian Walk record of 283.500km, set by **Barry Loveday (C62)** in Caboolture, QLD, in 2012.

Bad luck for David who picked up some bad blisters and faded a little in the second half, perhaps slightly undertrained on this occasion. But there were no such issues for Joff, who powered through the second 24 Hour period with barely a stop. He worked his way up through the field of runners to finish second overall (and first male) in the 48 Hour Australian Championship with a distance of **294.973km**, bettering the Australian 48 Hour Walk Open Record by 11km (obviously also setting a new Australian M50 48H Walk record into the bargain) and claiming the Male Australian 48 Hour Run Championship. The only runner who finished ahead of him was American Camille Herron who set a new Women's 48 Hour World Record of 435.336km. No shame in being beaten by that sort of performance!

For his part, David soldiered on, finishing the 48H with a distance of **266.705 km**, his second best overall. Australian Centurion **Anyce Melham (C65)** was also in action in the 48 Hour event but had a bad day in the office, deciding to retire after 92km.

It was wonderful to watch Camille, who added the 48 Hour Run World Record to her already long list-which included World Records/Bests for 50 Miles (5:38:41), 100km (7:35:50), 100 Miles (12:41:11), 12 Hours (151.11km) and 24 Hours (270.116km). Apart from Joff and Camille, Melbourne runner Greg Wilson also stood out, setting a new Australian M70 48 Hour Run record of 287.404km.

24 HEURES DE CHÂTEAU-THIERRY, CHÂTEAU-THIERRY, FRANCE 25-26 MARCH 2021

The weekend of 25-26 March saw the annual 24 Heures de Chateau-Thierry, held in the French city of Chateau-Thierry. This was one of the 2023 Paris-Alsace qualifying events and included the French 100km Walk Championship. As well as the 100km, there were a lot of additional events on offer – a 6 Hour Walk (2 divisions, one on the Saturday and one on the Sunday), and a 2x6 Hour Walk, along with anciliary 20km and 10km walks.

French walker **Florian Letourneau** won overall with the excellent distance of 201.142 km. It was his third win (he also won in 2022 with 201.220km and in 2019 with 191.223km). In the absence of 50km racewalking world record holder Yohann Diniz (who was a non-show), Letourneau was the star. A double winner of Paris-Alsace, he has competed in this, his home event, since 2014. If the cold and the wind bothered some participants, the walker from Château-Thierry was not amongst them. He won easily ahead of ultra specialists **David Vandercoilden** (192.408 km) and Belgian **Peter Asselman** (191.608km).

He was crowned French 100km champion at the same time. For him, the hardest part was to race both events (100km and 24 hours) well. "It was the first time I had done both," he explained. "It was complicated to walk quickly while keeping resources in reserve, but I managed well. I calmed down and recovered between 100km and 110km, then found a rhythm that suited me."

The women's race saw favorite **Morgane Ausello**, make up for her retirement during the 24 Heures de Bourges in February. She won easily with a distance of 184.074km, ahead of **Jennifer Gourves** (157.116km) and **Nadia Ducruet** (151.560km). Her win saw her more than 11km further than her winning distance of 173.442km in 2021. She was also the first woman to reach 100km (12:04:53), thus taking the 100km title as well.

Thompson, Michelle	1968	VIC	Michelle won our 2005 12 Hour run with 101.9 km, won our 2006 24H run with 166.053km, was second in 2008 in both the 6H run (57.596km) and the 12H run (105.974km), won the 2010 6H walk (49.1km) and 24H run (172.906km) double and won the 2011 6H Walk (53.784km) and 24H walk (172.593km) double. Has chipped away at the Australian Walk records with an ongoing series of superb walks since then and her walk records now read as follow: 6H (55.865km), 100km (11:36:29), 100 miles (19:53:59) and 24H (190.894km). It is great to see her back at Coburg again after a 4 year absence.
Zakis, Marnie	1974	VIC	I know Marnie from the racewalking world, where she competes in Melbourne. She started running in 2013, never having run a km in her life. She completed the Princes Park 6 Hour Run in 2018 and racewalked the 2020 Virtual Melbourne Marathon half marathon in December 2020. She then turned her sights on Coburg, entering the 2021 6H walk division and winning with a great first up 45.421km. She returned in 2022 for the 12 Hour walk and this year she has upped the ante even further, nominating the 24H walk.

Billett, David	1970	SA	David has 5 Coburg 24H finishes under his belt (2004-2007, 2022), 3 as a runner and 2 as a walker. He continues to amass impressive run and walk stats: around 70 ultramarathons, including 24 24-hour events, 10 48-hour events, 8 six-day races and 7 Coast to Kosciuszko finishes. Wow! He is also a 7 times centurion (walk 100 miles within 24 hours) and is back this time around to make it 8! Two weeks ago, he walked 266.705km in the Sri Chinmoy 48H in Canberra (including over 100 miles in the first 24 hours). Talk about a machine. Welcome back David.
Gregory, Maurice	1957	QLD	Maurice has only a small number of ultra appearances - Ned Kelly Chase 100 (DNF 80km), 2 Bays 56km, Blackall 100km (2021 finished and 2022 DNF 82km). It's great to see him now deciding to challenge himself with the 24H walk.
Hunter, Hugh	1960	VIC	Hugh, who first ran at Coburg way back in 2008, has done a huge number of marathons and ultra races (heading towards 200) throughout Europe/America/Africa and has a 24H Run best of 188 km, set in 2004. Over the years he has challenged himself with events that are off the beaten track, like the Marathon de Sables (254km across the Sahara) and the Yukon Arctic Ultra (300 miles). He shows his Scottish background by competing in a kilt so he is instantly recognizable on the track. Spent nearly 3 years working overseas in the Middle East from 2014 to 2016 (not exactly an ultra running climate) but returned to Melbourne in 2017, adding to his Coburg tally with finishes in the 2017 and 2018 and 2021 Coburg 24H runs. This year, he has swapped to his walking shoes and will do the 24H walk. We welcome him back for his sixth Coburg appearance.
Isaacs, David	1962	VIC	David competed in his first ever ultra at the 2021 Coburg Carnival, walking to a total distance of 107.573km in the 24H division. He was back again in 2022 with 91.300km. He returns this year fo rhis third 24H walk attempt. Welcome back, David!
Kandelaars, Arie	1964	NED	Arie is one of our overseas walkers looking for a centurion walk finish (100 miles) this year. It will be his fourth visit downunder, after falling short of the required total in our 2018, 2019 and 2022 events. It's a case of returning to complete unfinished business. Arie himself has 5 Centurion badges to his credit: African (2016, 23:52:00), English (2017, 23:49:27), NZ (2017, 23:36:29), Continental and USA (2018, 23:52:14). Five badges in quick succession and the aim is to add a sixth one in Coburg 2023.
Keating, Liam	1977		2019 was Liam's first ever ultra and he threw himself in at the deep end, choosing the 24 Hour walk. He was forced to retire after 68km will return this year (post covid) to complete unfinished business.
Leijtens, Thomas	2001	NED	22 year old Thomas is another of our overseas walkers. Although very young by ultra standards, he has walked 50 miles+ on approx 40 occasions, around 20 of them being 100km+ and 4 of them 100 miles. He has a 50 miles PB of 9:37:30, done in the Netherlands in 2019. An exciting addition to our walking field.
Lewis, Daniel	1977	VIC	Daniel competed in the Coburg 6H run last year, finishing with 49.134km. This year, he has upped the ante with an entry in the 24H walk. As he explains: "While knee issues have cruelled my efforts to run as much I'd like, I've given the middle-aged lycra brigade a wide berth and found enjoyment through the purity of walking. It's also helped me stay connected to my Strava friends – especially those in the ultraworld, a world I've dipped my toes into twice so far through six-hour runs including Coburg last year. For me it's always been about the journey to the starting line – the

			small goals, the weekly routine – and having the 24-hour walk as a goal has helped me to retain focus and, more importantly, kept my mental health in check somewhat. While I haven't yet mastered "fast" walking, I'm quietly confident of going long and giving a good account of myself!" Great stuff"
Ponych, Greg	1966	QLD	Greg has been running ultras since 2012 and has clocked up a lot of interesting finishes in that timeframe. His PBs are 67.598km (6H), 119.477km (12H), 181.712km (24H) and 271.520km (48H). His 48H PB came in the 2020 Butter 48H, which he won. He recorded his 12H PB in our 2021 Coburg Carnival. He also ran in our 2022 12H and returns once again tin 2023, but this time as a walker.

Svensson, Christer	1969	SWE	Christer has been one of Sweden's top walkers, both in racewalking and ultra walking modes, for many years now. He won the Swedish 50km racewalk way back in 1995 (4:26:06)and represented Sweden on multipl3e occasions in the IAAF Racewalking World Championships in the 50km (1999, 2006 and 2008). He has 3 Centurion badges (Continental C375 2009 22:09:06, English C1110 2013 20:19:28 and US C82 2016 20:14:50) and it will be great to see him in action here in Melbourne. He is still in great shape, as evidenced by his walk distance of 181km in the recent Rouen 28 Hour Walk in France.
Sweet, Paul	1953	VIC	It's always great to see one of our Coburg Harriers team mates in our Coburg Carnival so we welcome Paul back to Coburg 2023. Paul walked to a distance of 132.591km in the 24H walk in the 2022 Coburg Carnival and tells us that he loved everything about the event. So he is back this year for another 24H walk and will be hoping to get even further this time around.

Billett, Lorraine	1945	SA	Lorraine is more normally seen in crewing mode for her son David, who is a regular on the Australian ultra scene. She has, however, dipped her feet into the ultra world on a number of occasions, in both 6H and 12h and 24H walks. In 2017, she decided to see if she could set some W70 Australian walking records and she was successful, reaching 92.105km in the 2017 Coburg 24H. She was back again in 2018, going even further with 101.378km. Last year, she entered our 12H walk and set a new W75 Australian record of 39.192km. She returns again in 2023 to test herself again against the W75 standards.
Fitton, Susan	1969	VIC	Sue tells me that she loves our race so much that she has decided to dip her toes into the ultra world and try the 12H walk this year. Great to see!

Tewari, Anubhav	1982	VIC	Anubhav has done a number of marathons (>30) over the last 15 years and is also a Melbourne Marathon Spartan (10 finishes). He also has a number of ultras under his belt, including the Upstream Challenge 50km, The Tan 50km and the GOT Marathon (45k). He competed at Coburg in the 12H walk last year and is back again in 2023 for more of the same.
